UC Berkeley's arts and design landscape offers a distinctive and robust context for creative experiment, one enriched by the scientific and cultural wealth of a world-class public research university and propelled by an historic public mission and committed to access and social impact.

Alfred Hertz Memorial Concert Hall

This building is named for Alfred Hertz, the 1915–30 conductor of the San Francisco Symphony, who left his estate to Berkeley for music. **Hertz Hall's** 715-seat concert hall hosts free noontime concerts during the academic year. The building also houses the Department of Music's collection of historic organs.

Bancroft Dance Studio

Originally a church, this shingle-style building is now the home of **Bancroft Dance Studio**, and hosts the practices of performances of the Theater, Dance, and Performance Studies Department.

Berkeley Art Museum and Pacific Film Archive (BAMPFA)

BAMPFA is the visual arts center and film archive of UC Berkeley. Its mission is to inspire the imagination and ignite critical dialogue through art and film. Founded in 1963, the institution opened the doors to its current home designed by Diller Scofidio + Renfro in January of 2016.

Cesar E. Chavez Student Center

Located in the Cesar E. Chavez Student Center, the **Berkeley Art Studio** offers classes in ceramics, photography, drawing, painting, design, and printmaking.

6 Cal Memorial Stadium

Designed after the Coliseum in Rome by John Galen Howard and built in 1923, the Cal Memorial Stadium is home to UC Berkeley's football team and houses multiple campus programs, such as the **Haas Innovation Lab** and the campus' new visitors center.

🛈 Evans Hall

Evans Hall is home to the **Creative** Writing Minor Program, Media Studies, and the Interdisciplinary Studies Field Program.

Hargrove Music Library

Providing strong support for instruction, research, and the performance of music.

🕲 Hearst Field Annex

The Hearst Field Annex is the temporary home of the **Department** of English. In Fall 2017, the department will return home to the newly renovated Wheeler Hall.

B Hearst Greek Theater

Right in Berkeley's backyard, John Galen Howard's replicated Epidarius Theater hosts some of the Bay Area's most popular performances by internationally recognized artists and musicians.

Hearst Memorial Gymnasium

Designed by Bernard Maybeck and Julia Morgan, the Hearst Memorial Gymnasium is listed in the National Register of Historic Places and is home to the **Berkeley Writing Center** and **College Writing Program.**

Building Building

The Beaux-Arts-style Classical Revival building, the first to be built and designed by campus architect John Galen Howard, is home to Materials Science and Engineering Department and **Berkeley Institute of Design**, in addition to housing teaching and research spaces.

1 Jacobs Hall

The hub of the interdisciplinary **Jacobs Institute for Design Innovation**, Jacobs Hall contains 24,000 square feet of design studios and maker labs with access to the latest equipment for rapid prototyping and fabrication.

Morrison Hall

Built in 1958, Morrison Hall is the home to the **Department of Music.**

North Gate Hall

The historic John Galen Howard building is the home of the **Graduate School of Journalism** and houses the **Reva and David Logan Gallery of Documentary Photography.**

② Sather Tower

Popularly known as the Campanile, Sather Tower is the unofficial symbol of Berkeley. The Campanile plays a daily concert with the help of the **Department of Music**, tells the time, and functions as the most recognizable landmark on campus.

Outh Hall

Home to the **School of Information** (**iSchool**), South Hall is the oldest structure on campus and is a rare example of the Second Empire style. It was added to the National Register of Historical Places in 1982 and its roof is rumored to have been that of which "Mary Poppins" was filmed.

Stephens Hall

Stephens Hall is home to the Townsend Center for the Humanities and the Art of Writing Program.

Osutardja Dai Hall

Sutardja Dai Hall is the home of the Center for Information Technology Research in the Interest of Society (CITRIS), the CITRIS Tech Museum, the Berkeley Center for New Media, maker spaces and labs.

The University Libraries Bancroft Library

The Bancroft Library is the primary special collections library at UC Berkeley and is one of the largest and most heavily used libraries of manuscripts, rare books, and unique materials in the United States. The University Archive Gallery is also on site.

Valley Life Sciences Building

At over 400,000 square feet, the Valley Life Sciences Building was the largest in Berkeley when it was built in 1930. It remains one of the largest buildings on campus and is home to many of the Berkeley Natural History Museums, including the Museum of Paleontology and a life size model of a T-Rex skeleton, the Essig Museum of Entomology, the Museum of Vertebrate Zoology, the University and Jepson Herbaria, and the Human Evolution Research Center.

Wheeler Hall

Symbolizing "the light of learning," John Galen Howard's classroom building will re-open in Fall 2017 to welcome home the **Department of English, the College Writing Program,** and the 700-seat Wheeler Auditorium that hosts performances. The building features a French Baroque Façade, arched doorways, and a vaulted lobby.

🕲 Wurster Hall

Wurster Hall is one of the world's most distinguished laboratories for experimentation, research, and intellectual synergy. Home of the **College of Environmental Design,** the first school to combine the disciplines of architecture, planning, and landscape.

Ø Zellerbach Hall

Zellerbach Hall is the home of **Cal Performances**, producing and presenting performances of the highest artistic quality, enhanced by programs that explore compelling intersections of education and performing arts.

1 Zellerbach Playhouse

Theater, Dance, and Performance Studies Department student

6 Durham Studio Theater

Where the **Theater, Dance, and Performance Studies Department** stages productions, symposiums, workshops, and lectures.

O Dwinelle Annex

The historic John Galen Howard building is the home of the Arts + Design Initiative and the Arts Research Center.

8 Dwinelle Hall

Home to humanities programs, including Linguistics, Literature, Language, Rhetoric, Film and Media Studies, and Theater, Dance, and Performance Studies Department.

9 Etcheverry Hall

Home to **Department of Mechanical Engineering,** Etcheverry Hall was built in 1964 and once housed a research wind tunnel in its basement.

🕼 Kroeber Hall

Kroeber Hall provides professional art training within the context of a worldrenowned public research university. Home to **Art Practice**, **Anthropology**, **Phoebe A. Hearst Museum of Anthropology**, and the Worth Ryder **Gallery**.

B The Magnes Collection of Jewish Art and Life

An archive, library and museum, the **The Magnes Collection of Jewish Art and Life** includes art, objects, texts, music, and historical documents about Jewish art and life.

Doe Memorial Library

John Galen Howard's Beaux Arts building, The Doe Memorial Library supports the teaching, research, and instructional needs affiliated with more than fifty academic departments and programs, such as the **History of Art Department**.

Moffitt Library

Moffitt Library is one of the busiest campus libraries, housing the **Berkeley Center for New Media Commons,** Free Speech Movement Café, and the Newspaper Display Wall. productions take place in this facility.

University of California Botanical Garden at Berkeley

As part of the Berkeley Natural History Museums, the 34-acre UC Botanical Garden is one of the most diverse landscapes in the world, with over 10,000 types of plants including many rare and endangered species.

Center for New Music and Audio Technologies

Dedicated to multidisciplinary research and the creative use of sound, **Center for New Music and Audio Technologies** links the concert hall to the laboratory.

Lawrence Hall of Science

The Lawrence Hall is Science is a public science museum and research center for K–12 education at the University of California, Berkeley.
