



My dear Prime Minister:

Your letter of 1 June addressed to Major General P. J. Mueller, Chief of Staff, regarding the coal crisis is acknowledged.

The internationally publicized efforts of the Supreme Commander to procure food supplies for Japan from a critical world short supply indicates beyond need for amplification his full appreciation of the overall subsistence problem in Japan. The extent to which his food import program has been fulfilled is known to you.

With reference to your request for the monthly import of 3,000 tons of rice or wheat to be allocated to miners in Hokkaido from June through September, you are advised that since the receipt of your letter a request has been received from the Imperial Japanese Government requesting the release of 10,177 measurement tons of cereal foods for distribution in that area. This request has been granted by the Supreme Commander. In accordance with the approved system of preferential ration distribution to miners in Hokkaido this allocation, properly administered, should provide an adequate ration to meet the immediate requirements of the mine operating population and to satisfy your request. Future requirements should be considered carefully by you and will be met within the limitations of import allowances.

The fundamental difficulty with labor in the coal mining regions appears to be essentially a question of the adequacy of food supply. With the furnishing of additional food in compliance with your request it is probable that labor troubles will disappear. If not, the enactment by the Imperial Diet of the Labor Disputes Bill which has been prepared by the Labor Legislation Committee of the Imperial Japanese Government would appear to provide machinery for settling any disputes that may evidence themselves without the undue use of force. From every standpoint it is advantageous that such matters, internal to Japanese society, should be composed by the Japanese themselves without the intervention of the Armed Forces of the Occupation. These latter should be reserved for those extraordinary situations where the control of violence on a mass scale proves beyond the capacity of the Japanese Government and

people. A collapse of Japanese policy to this extent would be catastrophic for the nation.

Concerning your request for increases in oil imports to Japan in amounts of 3,000 tons in June, 5,000 tons in July and 10,000 tons per month thereafter, the Supreme Command Headquarters is working on a revised program of fuel oil imports with which your request will be integrated. It is impossible to revise the June schedule, however, since all shipments are either en route or scheduled and cannot be increased.

The coal consumption of the Occupation Forces is strictly regulated and it is not believed that these requirements can be diminished. The amounts required for this purpose are relatively small, approximating in June only 52,500 tons or 3% of the available monthly output. The exportation of coal from Japan under the critical conditions that now exist will be reexamined and you will be informed on this matter at a later date.



- (b) In view of the circulatory current system in the northern hemisphere, wide despersal is inevitable and mines from fields in Japanese home waters may be encountered anywhere in the Pacific Ocean areas north of latitude 20°N.
- (c) Dispersal of mines from Philippine Waters and the Dutch East Indies may also be expected. Expected directions of drift of mines from these areas and elsewhere tions of drift of mines from these areas and elsewhere in the western Pacific may be obtained from the "Streamline Current" chart.
- 2. Masters of all ships are to be instructed to be constantly conscious of the above circumstances and to be fully prepared for eventualities so as to minimize the danger to their ships during voyages in Pacific Ocean areas.
- Appropriate measures to be taken by masters of 3. ships include:
  - (a) Maximum degree of watertight integrity while at sea consistent with normal operations of the ship. Visiblity and areas being traveled will govern this to a great extent.
  - (b) Meticulous attention to life saving equipment to insure availability and completeness thereof.
  - (c) A thorough study of damage control measures.
  - (d) Adequate lookouts in daylight and instructions as to their responsibility to search the path through which the ship will pass.
