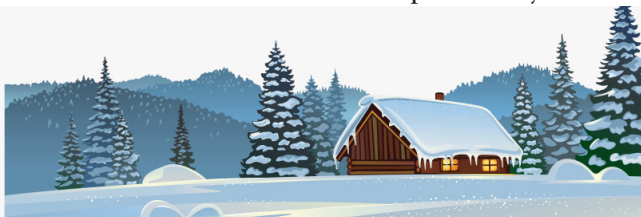
High School Band and Choir Winter Concert

District News

Dear Pardeeville Bulldogs,

The first three months of the 2021-2022 school year have gone by incredibly fast. Students, staff, and families have done a phenomenal job of dealing with many challenges while still achieving remarkable things. As we approach the end of the calendar year, there are a few important items to share with all community members:

PROPERTY TAXES

The final 2021-22 budget passed by the Board of Education had a decrease in property taxes of \$32, 613 or .58 percent compared to 2020-21. Every municipality in the Pardeeville Area School District received a lower property tax bill for 2021-22 than the bill they received in 2020-21. The major reason for the property tax decrease was an increase in state aid from the State of Wisconsin using federal funds related to COVID relief.

Besides the lower property tax bill, the Pardeeville Area School District once again saw property growth of 10.47 percent during the past year. Between the decrease in property taxes and the increase in property growth the mill rate for the School District dropped from \$9.26 per thousand dollars of property value in 2020-21 to \$8.34 per thousand dollars of property value in 2021-22. This is a 10.01 percent decrease. The last time the mill rate was this low was in the 2008- 2009 school year when it was \$8.45.

What does this mean for a property tax payer in the Pardeeville Area School District? In 2020-21 if you had a piece of property worth \$150,000 you paid \$1,389 in school taxes. This year based on the growth in property, that property is now worth \$165,705 and you will pay \$1,382 in school taxes, a decrease of \$7. Please note that this is an average for the entire school district and the impact on property taxes will be different in each municipality.

APRIL 2022 REFERENDUM

The administration, the Board, and Pardeeville staff have worked hard to be fiscally responsible with taxpayer dollars and offer the best programming possible with the money the school district receives. This year the current operational referendum that the school district depends on will expire. Therefore, a topic of discussion at recent school board meetings is the upcoming referendum.

On April 5, 2022, voters will be asked to decide whether to pass another operational referendum for our schools. The Board and administration will be discussing and most likely finalizing the exact dollar amounts to be included in the referendum question at the January 3rd school board meeting. Once decisions have been made expect follow-up information to be released.

STATE REPORT CARDS

As we move toward the holiday season and things get busy, I want to take this opportunity to congratulate all of our schools on their exciting school report card results. The Wisconsin Department of Education released their annual school and district report cards on Tuesday, November 17, and Pardeeville Area School District Exceeds Expectations. This is a wonderful accomplishment and something the entire community can be proud of. Pardeeville Elementary School once again received the Exceeds Expectations rating. This is the eighth time they have earned this rating. Pardeeville High School also Exceeds Expectations and Pardeeville Middle School Meets Expectations. Every member of the Pardeeville School District, our students, our families, and our community should be extremely proud of this achievement.

The Wisconsin school report card system measures academic achievement using the Wisconsin Forward Exam at all schools, while the ACT Aspire and ACT measures academic achievement at the high school. In addition, the report card measures growth, target group outcomes, and the number of students who are on-track to graduate. I hope everyone will enjoy the winter break. Students will be off school from December 23 through January 2. School will be back in session on January 3, 2022. I wish you and your family a relaxing end to 2021 and a great start to 2022. I look forward to sharing with you all the great things happening at Pardeeville Schools in the new year!

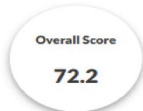

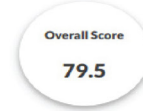

ESSER III Funds Stakeholder Input and Survey

ESSER III, the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund grant program authorized under American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act, provides additional money for local educational agencies (LEAs) to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19. ESSER III supplements ESSER I, created by the CARES Act in March 2020, and ESSER II, created by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act in December 2020.

The requirements of this third installment are more stringent than the first two rounds of the grant. This is one-time funding. It is essential to keep this in mind when planning and allocating for the use of funds. The funds are intended to prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID-19 and the effects the pandemic has brought to school districts.

Requirements include:

- Develop and post a Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity Plan
- Reserve 20 percent of funds for Evidence-Based Intervention Strategies (EBIS)
- Provide 80 percent of funds to safely open schools
- Provide stakeholders the opportunity to share

feedback on the use of the funds

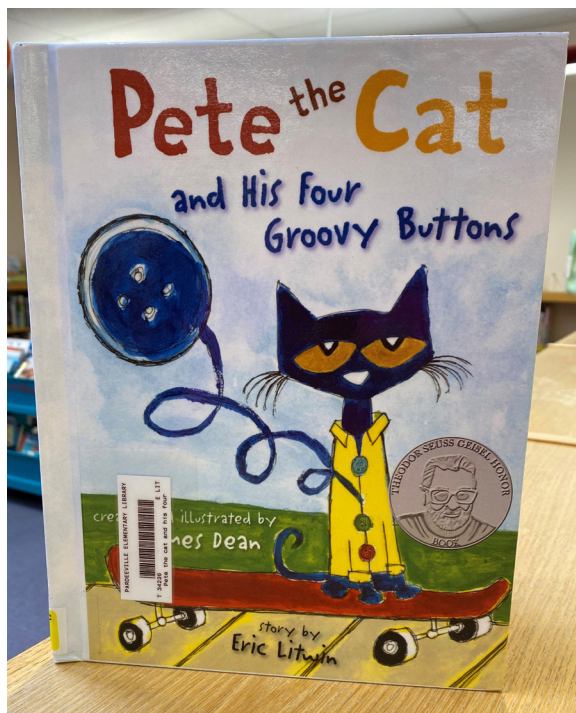
Pardeeville Area School District has been awarded \$985,641. Although there are restrictions, there is also flexibility in how we can spend these funds. However, we must also be cautious in allocating this money since it is a one-time funding opportunity. Some allowable expenses include, but are not limited to:

- Review of school safety plans
- Academic support materials
- Mental health services
- Additional academic staffing
- Additional custodial staffing
- Building upgrades to support a safer learning environment
- New/additional technology accessibility and/or devices

To provide stakeholders with the opportunity to share feedback a survey has been created for input on use of the funds. That survey can be accessed on the District homepage under “News and Updates,” or by going to <https://forms.gle/imW2qGd6uM5v81xL9>. This survey will be available for stakeholder input through December 28, 2021.

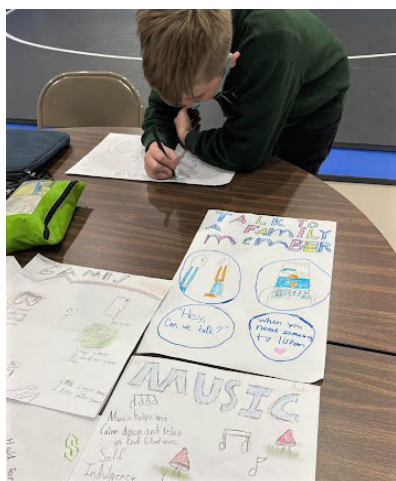
What's Happening in Middle School?

Baking & Pastry Science students toured the Baking & Culinary Labs at Madison College in November and then were able to make homemade quiche and cookies.



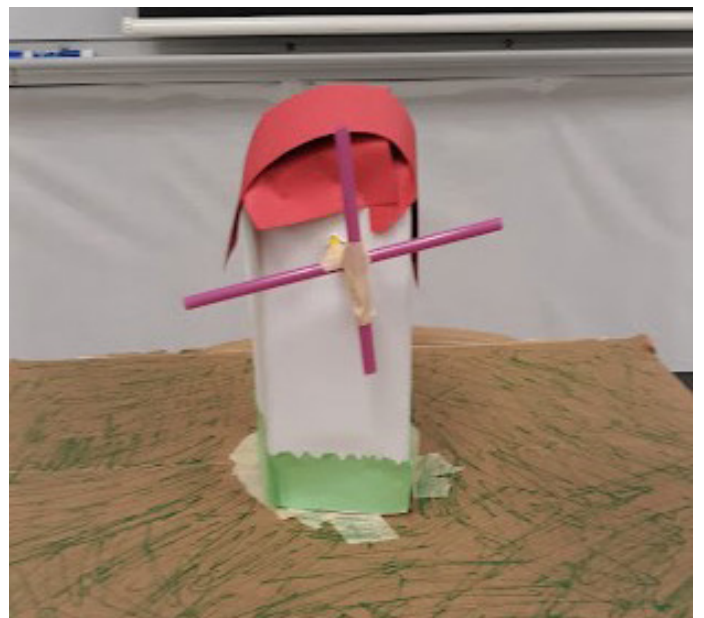

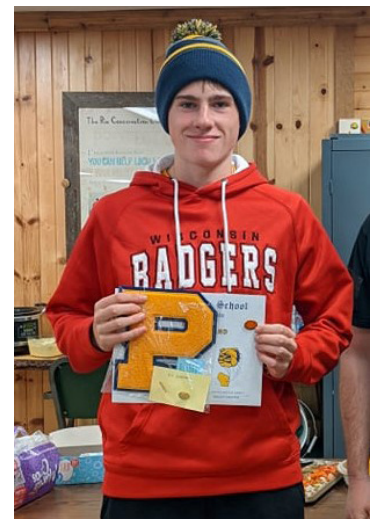

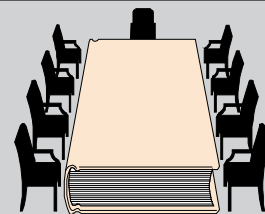

MINUTES REGULAR BOARD MEETING October 4, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Ms. Margo Pufahl, Board President.
